Brief content of the course (syllabus): General psychiatry. History of psychiatry. Current development in our country and abroad. Causes and mechanisms of mental disorders, epidemiology, prevention of mental disorders. Psychopathology: disorders of perception, thinking, memory, intellect, emotivity, will, acting and psychomotorics, consciousness. Syndromology. Classification of mental disorders. Complex treatment in Psychiatry (pharmacotherapy, psychotherapy, rehabilitation, resocialisation). Training in clinical interviews, mental state examination. Pediatric Psychiatry (selected mental disorders in child and adolescent). Social psychiatry.
